(1) Is there a minium size for the print mounts? Do they have to be on 16 X 20 mounts?

A: NO. The minimum size of the print is 64 square inches (8 x 8 Inches for example). The maximum is 20 inches wide however. So anything in between will be accepteable.

(2) When do they have to be taken to the contest?

A: They need to be taken to Pigeon Forge Office of Special Events--Stoplight #5---in Pigeon Forge between JANUARY 4-8 --9am until 4:30 pm OR on January 9 between **9** am and **1** pm to the

Convention Center at the Music Road Hotel in the Cello Room.

(3) Who can enter?

A: There is a place for everyone either Amateur or Professional depending upon the category and if you earn ANY money from your photograpy.

(4) When will they be judged?

A: Ribbons will be placed on the photographs at 9 am on Thursday January 14.

(5) Will there be monetary prizes?
