Press Release Information:

The Kingsport Senior Center Photo Group announces the sixth annual **Appalachian Photography Salon** in June 2009 at the Renaissance Center Gallery in Kingsport, Tennessee. The juried competition promotes interest in photographic excellence and is open to all amateur

photographers in the South Central Appalachian Region. To be eligible, each entrant must live with a 125-radius of Kingsport and derive no more than 25% of their income from photography.

Entries may be submitted in two **Divisions: Amateur and Proficient Amateur.** Entrants who have won in a previous APS, who have won awards in other regional competitions, or who are regularly accepted for exhibit in juried shows are considered **Proficient Amateurs.** All others are **Amateurs.**

Up to four entries may be submitted in **Monochrome** and **Color Print Categories**. A non-refundable entry fee of \$5 will be charged for each entry. First Place (\$200), Second Place (\$150), Third Place (\$100) and Honorable Mention (\$50) prizes will be awarded in each Division / Category. The KSCPG will display as many photographs as possible in the Renaissance Center Gallery from May 31 – June 24.

Mailed entries must be received the week of May 18-22, 2009. Hand deliveries will be received Friday, May 22 and Saturday May 23 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Kingsport Renaissance Center Gallery, 1200 E. Center Street. Judging will take place Wednesday, May 27, with the Awards Reception Sunday, May 31 from 2 - 4 p.m.
