Artwork, poems, puzzles, and short stories in *The Secret is Out – Discover Oak Ridge* were created by students from Oak Ridge schools. Area artists and photographers also donated their services to benefit ADFAC through the proceeds of this book.

The 2017 project was done as a part of ADFAC's 30th anniversary and Oak Ridge's 75th anniversary. Graphic designer, Ariana Rector, created the cover. She also illustrated many of the coloring pages and compiled the finished work.

The ADFAC committee, chaired by Becky Hook, included Jim Dodson, Cheri Donovan, Jane Palmer, and me. All proceeds go to help ADFAC support those in most need in our communities. Get your copy soon!

The Secret's Out - Discover Oak Ridge gives an overview of the unique history of the city that is full of activities for children ages five to twelve. Designed with the help of children and created for children the activities are fun and informative. A driving scavenger hunt included in the book allows residences or visitors to explore the city finding historical landmarks.

The book is divided into Historical, Parks & Recreation, Culture, Innovation and Education sections. The activity book replaced a 1991 coloring book sponsored by ADFAC and is dedicated to Oak Ridge children. The book contains children's art, poetry and perspectives as well as activities they will enjoy.


